**Subject: NPDES Permit No. NM0030759 – Request Deletion of Six Sites Planned for Deletion from the Individual Permit for Storm Water**

Dear Mr. Chen:

On May 19, 2015, and May 28, 2015, Los Alamos National Security (LANS) and U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) personnel met with representatives from the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) Surface Water Quality Bureau (SWQB) and the NMED-DOE Oversight Bureau to discuss the deletion of 27 Sites from Los Alamos National Laboratory's Individual Permit for Storm Water (IP) (NPDES Permit No. NM0030759). LANS/DOE and NMED agreed to the deletion of 6 Sites from the IP. Those Sites and the justification for deletion are as follows:

- 00-011(c), R-SMA-2.05: There is no evidence the Site existed.
- C-00-020, R-SMA-0.5: There is no evidence the Site existed.
- 16-030(c), CDV-SMA-1.4: Industrial materials were not handled.
- 35-016(m), PRATT-SMA-1.05: Industrial materials were not handled and the drain was never active.
- C-46-001, CDB-SMA-1: Industrial materials were remediated and storm water samples did not exceed target action levels for mercury.
- 35-004(h), PRATT-SMA-1.04: Industrial materials were remediated. The area was decontaminated and decommissioned and soils were removed to a depth of 15 ft below ground surface and replaced with clean soils.

LANS/DOE respectfully request the deletion of these sites from the current permit pursuant to Part 1.1.2 as a minor permit modification. The request for deletion of these six Sites and their accompanying justification was also included as Enclosure 5 of the comments submitted by LANS/DOE on the draft IP.
